Dramaturg's Note

Welcome to Indiana University's production of *Twelfth Night*! The story of *Twelfth Night* has become somewhat ubiquitous over the years, much like many of Shakespeare's more well-known plays. Perhaps you have never seen or read this play, but if you've seen *She's the Man*, *Shakespeare in Love*, or even the Disney Channel Original Movie *Motorcrossed* you have seen the influences of this iconic comedy. While there are many memorable parts of this story the heart of it can often be forgotten. The transformative power of love, while somewhat clichéd, shapes this piece. The story begins in a place of darkness as Olivia is mourning the death of her brother, while Viola is also mourning the loss of her brother in a shipwreck she barely survived herself. The play then, as one of our directors likes to describe, "spirals upward" as characters find their own paths out of the darkness that loss and more specifically loss of love has cast upon their lives.

In our production of *Twelfth Night*, we spiral upward with the help of some original music. The lyrics for these songs come from Shakespeare's text, but the music was composed and arranged by Jieun Ok, a graduate student studying composition and music theory at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music. We are fortunate to be able to have had such a collaboration as this music creates a path back to the light for as Duke Orsino says himself *"If music be the food of love, play on."*
